Chapter 5 The Shakers and the Millennial Church

AMONG the proselytes made by the French Prophets were James Wardley and Jane, his wife, of Bolton in Lancashire. Wardley was a tailor by trade, and, together with his wife, had been a member of the Society of Friends. Finding, however, greater satisfaction for their religious instincts in the ecstasies of the French Prophets, the Wardleys became the leaders of a group of persons living near their home who "joined with them in testifying against all the churches in standing." 1

The result was that

"In 1747 they were formed into a small society, without any established creed or particular manner of worship, as they professed to be only beginning to learn the new and living way of complete salvation, which had long been the subject of prophecy; and therefore they professed to be resigned to be led and governed, from time to time, as the spirit of God might dictate." 2

A short time afterwards the Wardleys moved to Manchester, to live with the Townleys, who had joined their society. John Townley was a mason by trade and was looked upon as considerably better off financially than the majority of the members of the organization at Manchester.

"Meetings were frequently held under the ministry of Wardley and his wife. Wardley's wife was called Mother; to her confessions of sins were made, though it was not so much insisted upon. She had the principal lead in their meetings, which were generally held at Townley's, at which meetings they sometimes sat silent a short space, then they would be seized with violent and tremulous motions, during which they would express their detestation against sin, and its contrariety to the divine nature. Sometimes their whole bodies would shake as if forcibly agitated by a strong hand; then they would sing and shout for the downfall of the antiChristian powers, and make signs, and walk swiftly and jostle against one another; they would jump violently, and shiver for a considerable length of time. Hence as appropriate names for them, they were called shiverers by some, and jumpers by others." 1

John Woods, who lived with the Shakers for about seventeen years, tells a similar story 2:

"A man I knew, who had fallen so frequently in this way, and so frequently confessed it, that he at length thought he felt a gift which might answer the purpose to mortify this propensity. In a room where a number of us were assembled, both brothers and sisters, without giving any previous notice, he openly and clearly exposed a certain part, which he said was to him as Alexander the coppersmith was to Paul, having done him much harm. While he exhibited he exclaimed, 'This is my god.' No one in the room seemed at that time to doubt the fact, nor his honest intention to mortify the flesh."

The efforts to "mortify the flesh" are suggestive of Roman Catholic efforts after sacerdotal celibacy.

"After working hard days, we were ordered into the dance, or labor as it was then called, for hours, and urged to labor more zealously to overcome sin. . . . Then, after dancing with vehemence through the greater part of the night, instead of reposing their weary bodies upon a bed, by further penance, lie down upon the floor, chairs, ropes, sticks, and every humiliating and mortifying posture they could devise." 3

Another practice for the mortification of the flesh was flagellation 1 a practice to which a stop was put through the influence of Mother Lucy Wright and Father Meacham. 2 In Mother Ann's time it was common.

"Though Elder Whittaker did not fully unite with this stripping naked, and would often leave the room, he said those gifts of Mother which he could not see into, he would not condemn. Several were whipped, and some were ordered to whip themselves, as a mortification to the flesh. A young woman by the name of Elizabeth Cook was stripped and whipped naked, by Noah Wheaton, for having desires towards a young man Abiel Cook, her father, hearing of it, prosecuted Noah Wheaton for whipping his daughter naked. Hannah Cook, sister to Elizabeth, who was present at the time, was called for a witness. She went to Elder Whittaker and asked him what she should say.

It also may be his proper to observe, that it was also said by the first leaders, "That no practice is wrong, nor any oath false, which is made to gain the cause of the truth, or to defend the gospel against error; though it might appear directly opposite to truth in the eyes of the world, yet as done for the cause of the gospel it is considered as true."

Some time after Whitaker's last journey, that I have mentioned, he went another and travelled from place to place above six months, in company with Daniel Rathbone, sen. who also often preached.

Elder William Lee seldom travelled to gain profelytes, being severe in his temper and harsh in his manners; his preaching was not fraught with that mildness and urbanity which is necessary to draw the attention and win the affections of the hearers, and sander a man beloved. It once happened as he was speaking to a public congregation, one of the spectators, a young man, behaved with levity and disrespect; upon this Lee took him by the throat and shook him, saying, "when I was in England I was sergeant in the King's life-guard, and could then use my fists; but now since I have received the gospel I must patiently bear all abuse, and suffer my fists to be kicked by every little boy; but I will have you know that the power of God will defend our cause."

Whitaker was more mild in his temper and soft in his manners, and accommodated by preaching to the feelings and sentiments of his hearers. He said he considered at many things of which he did not approve; but as believers came forward in the faith he was careful to correct, observing, that "any man must lack wisdom who should attempt to thresh his grain as it stands in

In order to mortify the carnal mind, their dances were excessive; and the various methods they practised to mortify and try that which they called the root of all evil, were truly astonishing. Several things which took place, for the sake of modesty, are here omitted. But I may observe thus far, that they itopped every avenue of their houses, so that the world's people, as they called them, could not see them, and had one or two of the brethren out to watch; they then stripped themselves and danced naked, when the gift or order came from Mother Ann to do so; those who would not be obedient had to walk out of the room, and such were generally mortified by being called "fleshy creatures—full of the flesh."

Notwithstanding their case not to be discovered by the world's people, this conduct by some means leaked out, and it was noised about that the Shakers danced naked. It appears that Daniel Rathbone, sen. was the first who as questioned concerning the truth of it. He gave no direct answer, being unwilling to expose his brethren and tters; he opened the matter to Whitaker for counsel in such cases; Whitaker told him he might deny it—or the first leaders held that they might deny the truth, at the same time speak the truth; for instance, they are not naked in one sense, being clothed with spiritual garments, "clothed with salvation"—2 Chron. vi. 41; "with righteousness"—Ps. cxxxii. 9; "If so be that be clothed, we shall not be found naked"—2 Cor. v. 3; though Elder Whitaker did not fully unite with their saying naked, and would often leave the room, he said the gifts of Mother which he could not fully see into, would not condemn. Several were whipped, and were ordered to whip themselves, as a mortification to the flesh. 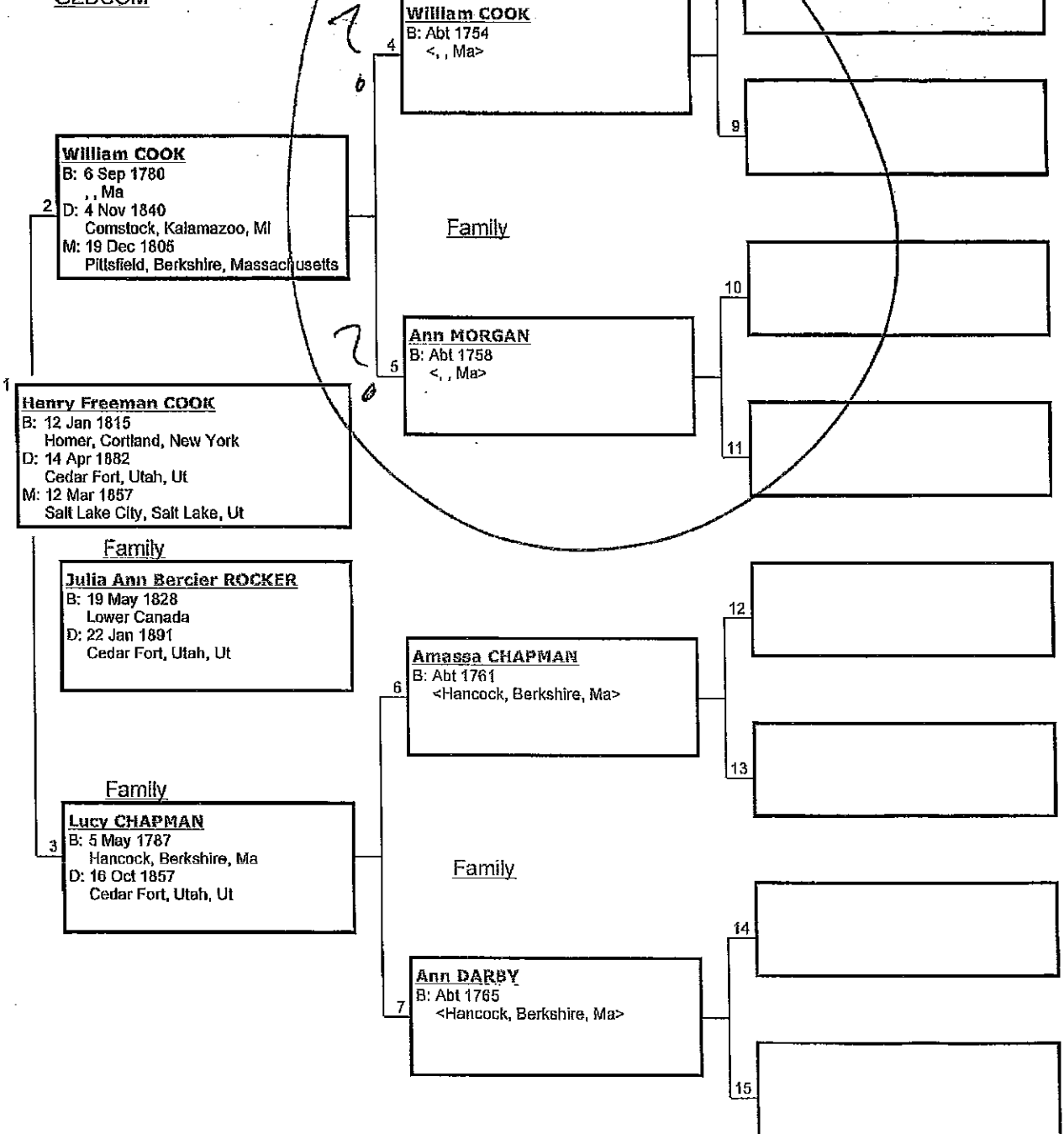

PIONEER: Henry Freeman Cook was born in Homer, Courtland, New York. After he married Sophronia Strobbridge they moved to the frontier to a small community called Comstock in Kalamazoo County, Michigan. After joining the church in 1843 Henry and his wife moved to Nauvoo. After

being driven out of Nauvoo they moved to Council Bluffs and St Louis. They came west in 1852 in the Warren Snow company*, arriving in the Salt Lake Valley October 9. Their children John (14), James Henry (12), Mary Jane (9), Hannah (7), William, (5) and George (2), and Henry's mother Lucy Chapman Cook came with them. They all spent the winter in Cottonwood, in SE Salt Lake Valley. In 1853 they moved to Cedar Fort, where Henry Freeman Cook lived and served the remainder of his life.

HISTORICAL NOTE: While researching for information concerning ancestors that crossed the plains before the railroad came to Utah I found that very little is known about the Warren Snow company. In fact, in 1997 I was told that until just a few years ago there was questions about whether or not there was such a company. Once they determined there actually was such a company they began calling it the 8th company, because they figured that it must have been the 8th company to arrive in Salt Lake in 1852. However, because so little information has been found about this company many to this day refer to it as the ghost company. Ronald S Cook

BISHOP - Henry Freeman Cook served as the 2nd bishop of the Cedar Valley Ward. He served from October 13, 1877 until he died April 14, 1882. Eli Bennett, Sr., John Carson Walter O. Sawyer and Boyd Estine Wilcox all served with Bishop Cook.

HISTORY: Cook, Henry Freeman (son of William Cook, born Sept. 6, 1780, and Lucy Chapman, born May 8, 1787, married Dec. 19, 1805). H was born Jan. 12, 1815. [Note: "Over the years Uncle Marion has consistently told us that the information in the church computer regarding the parents of William Cook, born 6 Sept 1780 is wrong. The Vital Records of Beverly, Massachusetts confirms what Uncle Marion has been telling us. From those records we learn that Anna Morgan was the 2nd wife of William Cook and they were married 25 July 1779. Their first child, William was born 21 May, 1780. The William we are looking for was born 6 Sept 1780. Also, those records report a William, 27 years old who died in Virginia in Nov 1806, but reported in Beverly. This is probably the son of William and Anna, that is suppose to be our grandfather. This William's death in 1806 would not make it possible that he is our grandfather. "I have not located any other children born to William and Anna. However, Uncle Marion has located a Hannah (Anna), born 21 Oct 1782, and

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Joseph, born 29 Jul 1784. No evidence that Job, born 1782 or Abial (Byle), born 1784 who are reported in the Lycander Berry letter as being brothers of our William, are sons of William and Anna who are in the computer as our William's parents. Another reason to question that this William is the William we are looking for." (Source of this information is the "Vital Records of Beverly Massachusetts" Vol #1 page 87 - 'Beverly Births,' Vol #2 page 71 - 'Beverly Marriages' and Vol #2 page 407 - 'Beverly Deaths.'" Note: LDS Church "Archive Records" list a William Cook born abt 1733 "of Marblehead, Mass. married to a Hannah Foster born 15 Oct 1737 of Beverly, Essex Mass. (2nd Wife is Anna Morgan born 25 July 1774). 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LIFE SKETCH OF HENRY FREEMAN COOK

By Gertrude C. Jackson (Great Grand Daughter), Written (?) Date

[Received from Darwin Isaac Cook, Tucson, Arizona on 25 November, 1959 by Alton Dean Cook] Henry Freeman Cook was born 12 January 1815 at Homer, Cortland County, New York. He was the fifth child and fourth son of William Cook, born 6 September 1780, at _____ (county), Massachusetts, and Lucy Chapman Cook. Lucy was born 5 May 1787 at Hancock, Berkshire, Massachusetts.

Henry's father and mother must have lived in Massachusetts until after the birth of their first two children. The census records list them as being born in Massachusetts. His mother was the daughter of Amasa and Ann Dedy Chapman. No trace of his father's parents has been found to date. Great Grand-Father had temple work done for two uncles, Abiel and Job Cook, which is the only clue we have to the number in his grandfather's family. Eight children were born to his parents.

We know very little about his childhood, but family history tells that the Cooks were farmers and stock raisers. He no doubt helped on his father's farm. Sometime between 1835 and 1838 the Cook family along with Henry his new bride, and other families of the area left New York State and went to Kalamazoo County, Michigan. Henry's uncle, Abiel Cook, was already a resident of Michigan, and had no doubt convinced the other families that they could better their lot by moving there. Abiel Cook died in Kalamazoo, Michigan in 1856.

Henry married Sophronia Strubidge (born 14 March 1813 at Solon, Cortland County, New York) on the 9th of April 1837 in New York State. Sophronia was the daughter of George Augustus (born 3 September 1785 at Chatham, _____ (county), New Hampshire) and Abigail Lull Strubidge.

They must have left soon after their marriage for Michigan. Their first child, John, was born in Comstock, Kalamazoo, Michigan on 22 May 1838. They had to work very hard in this new location to make their home. The history books of Michigan say that the mosquitoes and other insects were terrible and the soil seemed to be rampant with infectious diseases. Henry's father, William Cook, died there on 4 November 1840. On a visit to Comstock a few years ago, members of Henry's Great Grand-daughters found that William Cook was the first person buried in the Comstock Cemetery.

Three more children were born to them in Comstock; James on 14 January 1840, Hannah on 22 January 1842, and Mary Jane on 2 January 1844. The missionaries no doubt found them and taught them the gospel during this period, as the baptismal records show that Sophronia was baptized in March 1843 and Henry on 15 May 1843.

Sometime after the birth of their fourth child, Mary Jane, in January 1844, they moved to Nauvoo, Illinois. Their fifth child, Charles, was born there on 21 February 1846. They suffered the same persecutions as the other Saints. They had to leave this beautiful city almost before they were settled. Along with others of the Saints they went to Council Bluffs, Iowa for a while. Their sixth child, William (born 19 October 1847), and their seventh, George (born 20 March 1850), made their appearance here.

Shortly after the birth of George they moved to St. Louis, Missouri where they prepared to make the trip to Salt Lake City, Utah. They traveled with the Warren Snowy Company, arriving in Utah in October, 1852. For a year or two they made their home in Big Cottonwood, Salt Lake County. Their eighth child, Harriet Ann, was born there 20 May 1853. Their last two children, twin girls, Janet and Margaret, were born in Cedar Fort, Utah County, Utah on 17 March 1856. Just when they made the move to Cedar Valley in the old territory, no record. Their little Harriet died young and was buried in one of the first graves in the old cemetery.

Henry's mother, Lucy Chapman Cook, came with them to Utah, and made her home with them until her death 16 October 1857. She had left her home and her other children to come to the West with her son for the Gospel's sake. Her paternal grandfather's name was the daughter of Amasa and Ann Dundy Chapman.

Henry and Sophronia Cook seemed to have had a little more property than most of the families coming west. They had horses and cattle valued with them across the Plains. They may have also had sheep as there were sheep in the valley in the early days. Their daughter Hannah used to tell of a light grey or white team she remembered well.

Sometime after their arrival in the valley a group of immigrants came through on their way to California. They had a mare with them heavy with foal, which had given out, which they traded to the Cooks for a fresh mare. This mare was of fine blood and her colt proved to be a great horse. He was named Jeff and was sought out by the settlers for miles around to improve their stock.

A sporting man from the East saw the quality in this strain and paid a big price for one of Jeff's colts which he took back East. He found them being used to run a threshing machine. The Cook brand was and still is JHC, with the J and H combined. This animal was bred with the Cook brand, which was mistaken for JHC, which was the name given to him by his new owner.

He was a tough-mouthed animal, who required a special bit to hold him under control. A bit was designed and called the HC bit, which is still on the market. JHC was trained for cart racing, and was near the top in his racing record, being next to Minnie S at one time. She held the world's record in cart racing.

Jane Hacking Bisher was the midwife who took care of Sophronia when the twins, Janet and Margaret, were born. Sometime she would take her small son, Marout, with her when she went to care for Major and babies. He told Alice Cook that he remembered those visits with a warm feeling as he always got a big slice of bread and butter, which he didn't very often get at home.


On 11 June 1878 Henry Freeman Cook was ordained Bishop of the Cedar Fort Ward, where he served until his death, 14 April 1882. He was a kind, generous, quiet, industrious man, not given much to frivolity. A story is told of him by Amie Glines Haskins in her biographical sketch in which she tells of attending a dance in Cedar Fort. The band began playing a waltz, which the Bishop, along with other Church authorities, frowned upon. Youth-like, the young ladies of the Ward decided the Bishop and his counselors were going to dance, and so they converged on Bishop Cook and his counselors and pulled them out on the floor. Other young ladies kept them dancing for a considerable length of time. One of his sons, George (Dad for short) came into the dance hall and saw his father waltzing. He exclaimed loudly, "Father, you are really waltzing, I don't believe my eyes!" The Bishop was quite embarrassed, but he wondered if he didn't enjoy it a little.

Henry took part in all community projects—he owned shares in the co-op owned by the people of the valley. His son, John, helped to manage the store.

He married in polygamy, a young widow, Julia Ann Rocker Laughlin, with five small children. She was the widow of David Sanders Laughlin. They were the parents of four children, which made fourteen children of his own and five step-children, which made nineteen to raise and educate.

He passed away on 14 April 1882, and is buried in Cedar Fort. A pioneer of merit.

COOK cousins,

This is my first query, so I hope that I am doing it right:

My Revolutionary War ancestor was Abiel (or Abial) COOK(E), who was born in New Fairfield CT 26 May 1763 (according to his Revolutionary War Pension Application). I do not know who his parents were--that is where I hope one of you can help. He married 1st Margaret KRIGER (who was later accused of witchcraft) of New York State, 2nd Julia BARRAS of Massachussetts. He settled in Otsego County, New York. I am descended from Abiel's and Margaret's daughter, Lois COOK.

There is a Job COOK in New Fairfield in the 1800 Census, but not 1790 and not in 1810. There are no land records naming Abiel nor Job. The town records in New Fairfield burned in the mid nineteenth century, so there is nothing to be found there. Cemetery records have not turned up possible parents of Abiel. Job may be a brother or an uncle to my Abiel.

I have noticed that the given names Job and Abiel are quite common in the Rhode Island lines of Thomas COOKE, and have not found another line with those names.

I also have another COOK line. My grandmother married 2nd a Milton COOK probably in Shinglehouse, Potter County PA, in about 1935. I know very little about him except that he was a musician, and he died of cancer in 1953 or so. He adopted my father and aunt (my grandmother's children by her first marriage) as his own, thus my maiden name is COOK.

Thank you for any help you can offer.

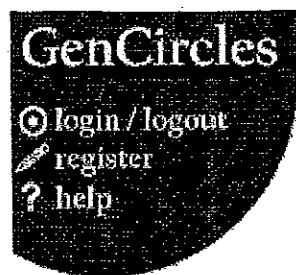

[Note: Marion Sherman Cook, son of Barnes Alma and Alice Adaline Southam Cook, says this William Cook is not the father of William Cook, born 6 Sep 1780 who married Lucy Chapman 19 Dec 1805. He would therefore not be the father of Job or Abial eather.

[Note: "Over the years Uncle Marion has consistently told us that the information in the church computer regarding the parents of William Cook, born 6 Sept 1780 is wrong. The Vital Records of Beverly, Massachusetts confirms what Uncle Marion has been telling us. From those records we learn that Anna Morgan was the 2nd wife of William Cook and they were married 25 July 1779. Their first child, William was born 21 May, 1780. The William we are looking for was born 6 Sept 1780. Also, those records report a William, 27 years old who died in Virginia in Nov 1806, but reported in Beverly. This is probably the son of William and Anna, that is suppose to be our grandfather. This William's death in 1806 would not make it possible that he is our grandfather. "I have not located any other children born to William and Anna. However, Uncle Marion has located a Hannah (Anna), born 21 Oct 1782, and

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Joseph, born 29 Jul 1784. No evidence that Job, born 1782 or Abial (Byle), born 1784 who are reported in the Lycander Berry letter as being brothers of our William, are sons of William and Anna who are in the computer as our William's parents. Another reason to question that this William is the William we are looking for." (Source of this information is the "Vital Records of Beverly Massachusetts" Vol #1 page 87 - 'Beverly Births,' Vol #2 page 71 - 'Beverly Marriages' and Vol #2 page 407 - 'Beverly Deaths.' The book identification numbers in the Salt Lake Family History Library are: US/CAN 974.45 / B2 Vol #1 and Vol #2. (The above was printed in the "Barnes Alma and Alice Adaline Southam Cook Family Roots & Branches Committee Report" March 3, 1993.) Note: LDS Church "Archive Records" list a William Cook born abt 1733 "of Marblehead, Mass. married to a Hannah Foster born 15 Oct 1737 of Beverly, Essex Mass. (2nd Wife is Anna Morgan born 25 July 1774). 




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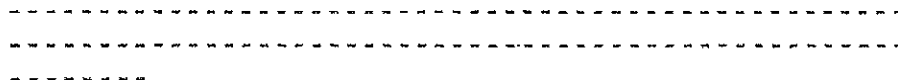
